Jesus shares with his disciples the mission for which God sent Him to the world. Wow! What a great privilege to take the baton from Jesus and continue with the redemptive work. The mission is God's initiative to save humanity that is lost. There is no other deeper reason than the love for humanity on the part of God, who gave his son to save us and give us eternal life.

Whoever by faith accepts what Christ did on the cross in their favor voluntarily and not by obligation, has the forgiveness of his sins. This is between God and the sinner. because Jesus touched his heart, and not because he just raised his hand mechanically or by social coercion.

But on the contrary, all those who voluntarily reject his word of forgiveness, decide to stay with their sins and not take advantage of the opportunity of friendship with God that has come into their lives.



Do you know something? God continues to seek and call people like you to give them a mission in life, because the harvest is still great and the workers are few, and in the words of Jesus we are given the divine mandate that has three emphases.

The apostle Paul, after more than 30 years of service, understood the depth and wonder of his call and wrote with his heart and in his hand to his son Timothy in faith, "I have fought the good fight; I have finished my race..." 2 Timothy 4:7

My mission

We Christians are sure that we are born with a purpose. For this to be realized, we have to team up with God. Passion, commitment, goal setting, and a winning attitude are required.

But all this is wrapped up in being clear about, what is my mission? To answer this question, it is necessary to analyze the following points. My mission starts with salvation. In this aspect, what Jesus accomplished on the cross is recognized, that i am a sinner and require his saving love. Then, realizing that life is different and that i am now a child of God, i am called to testify of salvation and the message of love.

2 My mission is to be a disciple of Jesus. As a new creature, it is required to be an apprentice of Christ who grows, through the Bible, the Holy Spirit, the church, and the leaders. New converts can be helped to form their Christian character and be prepared with the tools available to be fishers of men.

My mission is to get involved in evangelism. This missionary part is the time to put into practice everything received and learned, the challenge is to share the faith and announce the good news in different and creative ways in order to reach many who require God and His salvation by grace





My mission is to obey the great commission.

Two commissions are found in the Scriptures, a dual message meant to be obeyed. If you love God, his commandment will be obeyed. As children of Him, you should obey and Go and Make disciples with boundless joy.

My mission is to seek and save those who need Christ. Jesus had as a mission: to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor. (Luke 4:18-19). When reading this text, the writer Max Lucano observes the most comprehensive mission in history, where the human being is saved in all of his being. That is a legacy that must be continued through service and evangelization for us, thus emulating the mission of the Lord.

My mission is to form and inject others with the DNA of evangelism. In the narratives of the four gospels, a whole evangelist training strategy is developed, directed at twelve men who were taken from theory to practice. Once saved, each believer receives the DNA of evangelism, which is urgently transmitted to many, so that evangelism is activated in everyone and thus reaches all people and all nations through a centripetal and centrifugal personal mission.

All Christians are called and invited to discover their mission. What has been addressed in the previous paragraphs can serve as a point of reflection on your mission, a reminder, a map, and an opportunity to receive and activate the mission that we all have. In the words of Samuel Escobar, "What is the mission of the church in the world? Share the good news, go to others with the message of Jesus Christ, the church exists for this mission." When you discover your own mission, you are ready to share and go to people with the message of salvation. Do you as a reader know what your mission is?





WITH THE MIND

had the opportunity to live for a few years in Mexico City, there I was able to see various peculiar scenes, from book sellers presenting their novelties outside the subway, to freestyle rhymers narrating the daily life of the city; but there was a particular scene that marked me to such an extent that I want to share it with you in the following lines.

I left my place of work wanting to clear my head a bit and get some fresh air, I headed to a Metro station, where, on the one hand, vendors of fried foods and corn were trying to persuade me to buy, so I changed my view. On the other side, I saw a small group of young people who shared the message of Jesus in the open air. It especially caught my attention that at that moment a listener interrupted the presentation of the young man who was speaking and commented that he had reservations with the Bible as the carrier of God's message, because much time had passed since its original writing, and therefore, it was not reliable.

To my surprise, it was pleasing to see that two of these young people approached this person who listened to him with respect and attention and sought to answer the questions he asked;

They talked about the Bible and its conservation throughout history, about the peculiarity of Christianity and other topics. By that time, I had already asked permission to come closer to listen. They continued talking for a few more minutes, and the messengers invited their interlocutor to extend the conversation and clarify some points in greater depth, but he refused and decided to withdraw.

What I saw that afternoon left a pleasant taste in my mouth, although it would have been better if the conversation continued. Seeing young people sharing the gospel prepared to give reason for their hope with respect, security and knowledge of the facts was somewhat challenging. They were a group of women and men who shared with conviction and emotion the message of Jesus the savior, which also challenged their mind.

It is curious how in some environments it has been emphasized that you have to preach to the heart and not to the head, but witnessing this situation I realized that it is necessary to share the message of our Lord Jesus also using the mind. He demands "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind and with all your strength" (Mark 12:30). Sharing the gospel appeals to reasons, emotions, existential needs and will, and these young people showed me that they were prepared to share Jesus with those who harbored questions. It is true that some people only ask questions to win a debate or make others angry, but there are also others who want to find answers.

How good it is to see brothers and sisters who share Jesus with clear reasons and arguments! Our Lord came to save the world and let us know the reason - because he loves us. (Jn. 3:16) He Himself shows us the way to connect love and reason!





In this month of evangelism, we can make a commitment to prepare ourselves and share the good news of salvation, believing in the supernatural saving work of Jesus and explaining with God's help the great reasons to affirm that Jesus is true and trustworthy.





The apostle Peter writes it in the following way: "But in your hearts revere Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect." 1 Peter 3:15. Here we can see at least three important points.

The first recipients of this letter were the community of believers who were scattered beyond Jerusalem Jerusalem, with the permission of Rome, as the persecution of Christians by the Jews began. See above comment. It is curious that even in this situation of flight and suffering, these followers of Jesus shared the gospel. How was it possible to share good news in times of difficulty that they were experiencing? Peter reminds them that they can expect a good outcome from everything they are experiencing, and gives reasons it - a living hope for the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, what can we who are followers of Jesus expect in the future? The apostle reminds them that in Jesus there is salvation and a good future, since He promised to come back for them (1 Pet 1:3-7).

At that time they had heard promises of false messiahs, and there were also deceivers and charlatans or magicians who used strange devices. Perhaps that is why people asked for data and reasons why these persecuted evangelists could be trusted. It is important to clarify that the simple fact of preaching the risen Jesus had cost them persecution, but if that was not enough for the listeners, it was also necessary to explain, describe and even defend the hope that these early Christians had. Getting ready is not a waste of time, it is the way to strengthen hope and be in a position to share it.

In this passage he shows us that the mind and heart are intertwined in the practical life of the Christian, since he exhorts us to honor Jesus in our hearts and prepare to give reason for hope. The miraculous work of change of heart, purification and new life in Jesus, although it has its supernatural aspects not so easy to explain in detail, it also has understandable, communicable and fact-based aspects, as well as promises from God for humanity that is It that are necessary for everyone to know. That is why the heart and the mind work intertwined, to maintain our convictions, organize and understand reasons, leaving the task of convincing to the Holy Spirit.

It is then that today despite experiencing adverse situations, we can share reasons for our hope with the support of Jesus who died and rose from the dead. Today as in the first century AD. there are deceivers and skeptics, but it is possible to share facts, explanations, and arguments so that people consider the gospel as something truthful and reliable. Preparing in the local church, with personal readings, in educational institutions or discipleship groups, should be a priority to share the gospel in the best way.



Thus, in our daily life, to love God with all that we are, is to love him with our heart, strength, soul. It our mind, for the glory of Him and the service of the people around us.

NOTHING IS HAPPENING HERE

A few years ago, together with some young people, we developed a missionary project for a couple of weeks. We went to a place where they lent us a house to live in and we went out every day to do activities with children, door-to-door evangelism, and discipleship with those who were accepting and hearing the word. I remember that one afternoon, we were walking under the intense sun, we were tired, it was already the last days and physically all we wanted was to sit in the shade and let time pass. As we walked along the dirt paths, seeing green fields beside us, we began to talk about how it would have felt to go preaching in the time of the apostles, and we wondered if it would be something similar, if they would have also been tired like us, and what would have motivated them to keep going. At one point in the conversation, we felt as if we were in those times. It reminded us that the one who had sent us there was not the district or our church, but God Himself. because that was our purpose and our mission for that place. The talk led us to regain new strength, to feel that, although on the outside we were worn out, on the inside we had been renewed. We continued continued walking until the end of the day's work, speaking with emotion about the good news of salvation to everyone we met in the road and at home.

Many times, the slow work, the rejection of people, the lack of planning, or the lack of support from those who we would expect to respond, lowered our spirits in the attempt to serve God by preaching his word, and made us question whether or not we were in the right place. On more than one occasion I remember saying when I left a home or when I finished talking to someone "I think nothing is happening here", and a short time later it is as if the Lord himself said "if you saw the things I am doing within these people, you would not say that again. "I have understood that it is not we who achieve the transformation in them, but we plant the seed that God makes grow. We are seeing little by little the change in people's behavior, in attitudes, in the greeting they now give and before they denied, in the questions they ask, ask, and in the lives. I have understood that although it seems that nothing is happening, something is always happening in God's plan.











"Thank God because he gives us the privilege of being tools in his hands, of being strengthened by him to move forward, and of being enriched by the miracle of seeing lives transformed by our wonderful God. Although it seems that nothing is happening, something is always happening in God's plan.

In 2 Corinthians 3:2-5 the apostle Paul talks about the work they did among the Corinthians, the well-developed ministry they carried out, so much so that he compares them to letters of recommendation that everyone can read. They have not that have not been written with ink on paper, but by God in the hearts of each one of them, because they know that they are a testimony of the power of God that acts in the lives of those who listen to the word and decide to trust in Christ for the rest of their lives. I love to think that each person with whom we have the privilege to speak and guide to accept the plan of salvation, becomes a letter of recommendation, not of what we are capable of doing, but of what God can do using people.

We are simple, and certainly not qualified, but our aptitude comes comes from God, as mentioned in 2 Corinthians 3:5 (NLT). So today, God reminds us that it is time to write living letters with help. He will be the one who transforms hearts, and you and I, willing and prepared by him, will be the Sowers of seeds. Even if it seems that nothing happens, the kingdom of God will continue to spread and the world will be able to read what God does with people who decide to believe in Jesus.

Throughout my life I have seen and met leaders who really make things happen, impact communities with evangelistic activities, seek ways to help those in need, passionately share Jesus and disciple new believers cooperating in the growth of the Church of the Nazarene throughout history.

However, there is the other side of the coin, and unfortunately this is the majority. There are people who have accommodated themselves only to fulfill religious acts. By this I mean attending services, singing, listening to the word, offering and greeting with a big smile. This is apparently very good, many have changed their lives, but they have NEVER really accepted the mission to which we were called and we saw earlier in the verses of Matthew: to make disciples of all nations by baptizing them in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.

It is worth mentioning that my intention is not to judge or point someone out. I consider that we have all been victims of this accommodation and conformism within the church, and despite the fact that in many sermons we have been warned of this trap, we ignore it. Of course, not all, but what has always been needed for the church to grow and people to know the Truth, ARE LEADERS, people like Jesus, capable of giving hope, the meaning of life and guiding them on the right path. Is this easy? Absolutely not, but it is our mission.

Now, I want to ask you some questions so that together we can reflect: do you consider yourself a leader? Please, answer honestly. If the answer is a resounding "yes" let me congratulate you and encourage you to continue developing. On the other hand, if your answer was a shy "no", I must ask another question - do you want to accept the mission of being a Leader?

I know Sometimes we don't see ourselves as great leaders, speaking out and leading crowds to Christ and good deeds, but this is where I connect with what I mentioned at the beginning. We only have one life! If we don't impact in this life, we never will. A very good example that is used to make it clear that God can call anyone is that of Moses, who made many excuses to tell God that he was not a leader and could not mobilize thousands of people. if you have the opportunity read this story in Exodus 3. There you will see that it is not because of our own abilities or skills that we are called to fulfill a mission, but because God chooses us and gives us the opportunity for Him to be manifested through us. Fulfilling the mission seems impossible by our means, but with God's help it is something we can achieve.

A mission can be defined as the faculty or power that is given to one or more people to carry out a certain duty or assignment. Other times it is defined as the reason for being of something or someone. Also, it is related to the action of sending. If you are reading this text, it is because God wants to empower you and send you to fulfill a mission. It may be helping those in need, cleaning the environment, educating people or giving them meaning in life. I don't know what God has planned for you, but you can discover it. God has given you everything you need to achieve it. Our limitations are often only in our mind.

I don't know about you, but I don't want to continue neglecting the mission entrusted to me. I want to reach people, mobilize them, help them and disciple them with the help of Christ. I want to be a leader like *He was. It's easy to be a spectator* and do what we are told to do. The what they tell us to do, the difficult thing is to be a protagonist and be courageous. Fear and comfort paralyze. Do; fear and comfort paralyzes, do not let this happen to you. Arm yourself with courage and become a missionary. Fulfill the mission to which you were called.

When I realized that all these groups that participate in a mission trip for a week had gathered their money to pay for their trip, that is, to collect around ten thousand dollars to leave a project to an unsaved person they had never met, that is something that only the love of God makes happen. Also in an even deeper sense of mission is the love that moves our hearts, our resources and our passion to make God's mission our mission.

Talking about evangelism in a historical moment just like the one we are living continues to awaken in my heart the passion of what our mission means in its essence. At the same time, we remember what it has meant in the last five years in the ministry in the North Central Field, and even more, what it should continue to mean in the heart of the church of Christ as Nazarenes.

God allowed me to lead the evangelism ministry in the North Central field, I had the honor and privilege countless of coordinating evangelism events with Jesus Film groups that have traveled from the United States. In all of them I have been able to feel the love and interest of each participant for those who still do not know Jesus Christ, In each participant I have observed that they come with a mission, and none of the situations that comprise the trip or the fatigue has discouraged them from fulfilling it.

Because from my experience all of us who are committed to Christ, see all this as their mission, and in very personal terms my mission, because there is a genuine conviction that we are called, that God chose us to bring good news.

Bringing to mind these last five years traveling from Nicaragua, Honduras, El Salvador to Guatemala, sharing the gospel with many groups, without a doubt, there is no better experience than working for almost three intense days on a project to impact those who do not know Jesus. In the midst of fatigue and physical exhaustion, seeing people who are touched by the cinematographic message of Jesus Film in the nightly projections and witnessing that they respond to the call to receive the gift of salvation through the sacrifice of Jesus, there are no words. Emotions overflow when seeing how the "Misio Dei",

(God's Mission), now becomes "my mission", and is seen accomplished at that moment, in that place, with that person who never imagined that God would bring him to a group from so far away just to put within their reach that love and solution to a basic need but so full of hope that not only has it changed their existential reality, beyond this, the eternal reality of their own salvation.

As I would like many to understand that being a Christian is much deeper than just attending a temple, or being part of a ministry, ministry. Unfortunately many continue to believe that if there is a mission, that mission is for "a certain class" of Christians who have been called for that, and we call missionaries. They also believe that others have other ministries without connecting with the Mission God. However, it is necessary for us to reiterate that making disciples is not a mission for others, it is literally your mission and mission. Regardless of an appointment or assignment, we all have a mission to fulfill, just as our global mission statement of the Church of the Nazarene says, "Making disciples in the likeness of Christ". That is our mission, that is My Mission.

<u>Ready Set Go</u> <u>Guatemala</u>



The International Nazarene Youth of Central Guatemala celebrated its first district vigil after the pandemic with the participation of 320 young people. We had the main participation of ReadySetGo Movement, who motivated them and gave them ideas to be able to join the month of evangelism in a dynamic way through sports.
